- New Jersey is located in the Middle Atlantic Region of the United States.
- **Climate** is the weather in an area over a long period of time.
- The Climate in the Mid-Atlantic Region is moderate.
- New Jersey typically has cold winters, warm summers, and a brisk autumn.
- The **Atlantic Coastal Plain** is a region of New Jersey with miles and miles of sandy beaches.
- The **Ramapo River** is located in the Piedmont region.
- **Cape May** is located in the Atlantic Coastal Plain region.
- The **Central Corridor** region is also known as the Piedmont region.
- Jersey City, Paterson, Elizabeth, and **Newark** are among NJ's **LARGEST cities**. Know which city is the LARGEST.

- **FOSSIL FUELS** are created from once-living plants and animals. They are used to heat homes and to make airplanes and cars run.
- A **RENEWABLE RESOURCE** is one that can be replaced. Trees and water are two examples of renewable resources.
- A **NONRENEWABLE REDOURCE** is one that cannot be replaced. Zinc and granite are examples of nonrenewable resources.
- A **mineral** is something that comes from the earth.
- An **ECOSYSTEM** is a community of landforms, plants, people, and animals.
